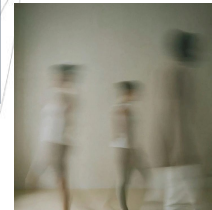
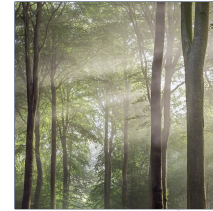
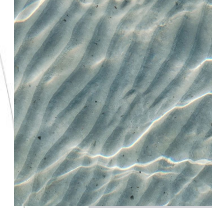


Design Concept Summary

The bathroom is reimagined as a domestic common, organized around a communal water table that supports daily rituals of care across generations. Rather than separating users into individual fixtures, water becomes the spatial center where washing, assisting, resting, and play can occur simultaneously.

The layout is structured by levels of speed and assistance rather than by age: slow and assisted use near seating and grab supports, interactive washing at the central basin, and fast private use at the perimeter. This allows different users to share the room while maintaining appropriate degrees of privacy.

Located at the center of the home, the bathroom becomes a space where the day begins and ends collectively. Natural light and a central tree introduce time, softness, and comfort, easing shared intimacy while anchoring the space around water. Through layered privacy and shared routines, the bathroom becomes an architecture of everyday togetherness.

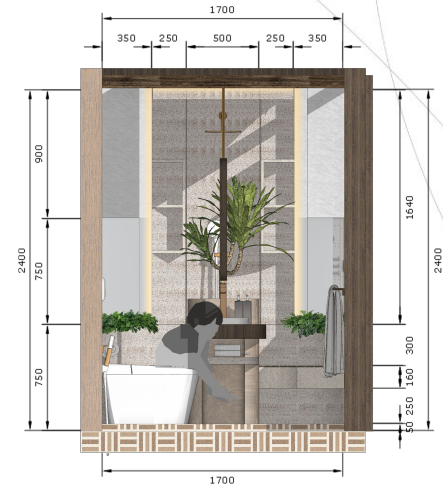

Design Visuals: Overview

In a shared family life with limited time and space, the bathroom is reimagined not as a hidden service room, but as a **domestic common** where intimacy and efficiency can coexist. Located at the center of the home, it becomes one of the most frequently shared spaces—where the day begins and ends collectively.

Rather than forcing users to wait in sequence, the layout supports **overlapping routines** through layered privacy and multiple speeds of use. Family members can occupy the room simultaneously—resting, assisting, washing, or moving quickly—without disrupting one another.



Design Visuals: Overview

Integrated within the garden, the bathroom is naturally ventilated and illuminated, allowing **time to be felt through shifting light, shadow, and seasonal change**. A central tree anchors the space vertically, while the water table organizes activities horizontally, forming a calm yet active spatial field shaped by daily rituals.

In this setting, bathing is no longer a transient task, but a shared moment of presence—where care, play, and rest become part of everyday domestic life.



Design Visuals: Full Bathroom

The bathroom is not designed for fixed age groups, but for **different physical and temporal needs**. From left to right, the space is organized into three continuous zones: **assisted use, interactive core, and fast private use**.

The shower area provides seating edges, hand showers, and stable flooring, allowing care to happen naturally and safely. At the center, the water table and basin form the interactive core, where users meet, pause, and share everyday routines. At the perimeter, the toilet and storage are placed for quick access, supporting efficient use without interrupting the communal space.



Design Visuals: Shower Area

This zone supports **slow and assisted bathing**, where sitting, washing, and helping can happen comfortably.

Soft seating edges, hand-held showers, and anti-slip flooring accommodate reduced mobility while remaining open to visual connection with the rest of the room.

Here, care becomes a visible and natural part of daily life— not hidden behind partitions, but integrated into the shared domestic ritual.



Design Visuals: Toilet Area

Placed at the outer edge of the layout, the toilet area allows **fast and private use** without crossing the wet communal core.

Storage is integrated for immediate access to daily necessities, supporting short and efficient routines.

While visually connected to the shared space, this zone maintains functional separation, allowing privacy to coexist with collective use.



Design Visuals: Basin Area

The basin forms the heart of the bathroom, functioning as a **water table** around which everyday interaction occurs. Rounded edges, low height, and surrounding access allow users from both sides to gather, assist, or simply pause.

Hanging mirrors extend the sense of shared space while maintaining safety through soft geometry.

Here, water becomes not only a utility, but a medium of communication, play, and care across generations.



Design Visuals: Optional Images/ Information

Natural ventilation, daylight, and a central tree connect the bathroom to the rhythms of the garden and the day. Shifting shadows and changing light conditions allow users to **sense time through atmosphere**, not clocks.

This connection softens the intensity of shared intimacy, grounding daily routines within a calm, living environment.

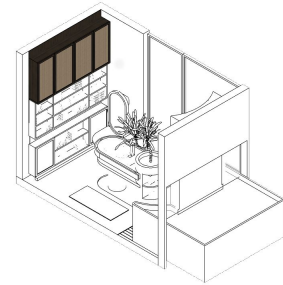
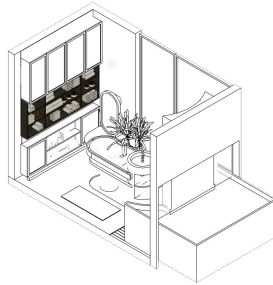
Storage is organized not by ownership, but by **reachability and frequency of use**,

The lowest racks are placed at child height, allowing children to access towels and personal items independently.

Mid-level storage is positioned at seated and standing reach, providing the easiest access for grandparents and users with limited mobility.

Upper storage accommodates parents' belongings and items used less frequently, offering larger capacity while keeping the communal zone visually clear.

This horizontal layering of storage reinforces the spatial logic of the bathroom, supporting autonomy, care, and efficiency within the same room.

- What is the inspiration for your design?

The design is inspired by the warmth of togetherness commonly found in a grandmother's house, where the bathroom is not merely a functional space but an integral part of everyday family life. The space is naturally shared by multiple generations children, adults, and the elderly each with different needs yet connected through daily routines. This value is translated into a toilet design that emphasizes inclusivity, comfort, and emotional connection, while maintaining a warm and familiar atmosphere that feels like home.

- How does the design fulfill the need of the target users?

The design is created to accommodate multi-generational users by prioritizing safety, comfort, and ease of use. Thoughtful details such as integrated hand grips at the washbasin area, clear circulation, and sufficient spatial allowances support users of all ages. This approach enhances independence, reduces the risk of injury, and creates an intuitive space that is accessible and comfortable for every family member.

- How does the design fulfill the design challenge?

The design addresses the challenge of a family toilet by integrating functional requirements with emotional value. The centrally placed washbasin acts as the core of activity and a transitional element between private and shared areas. This spatial arrangement encourages light daily interactions without compromising comfort or dignity, transforming the toilet from a purely utilitarian space into a human-centered and meaningful environment.

- How does the choice of products contribute to the purpose of the design?

The selected products are characterized by clear specifications, ergonomic design, and adaptability, allowing the space to respond effectively to diverse user needs. By emphasizing comfort, safety, and intuitive use, the product choices support an inclusive toilet environment that remains practical, refined, and responsive to everyday family life.


